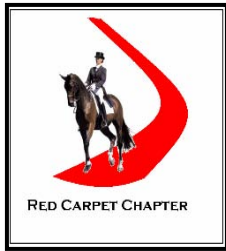

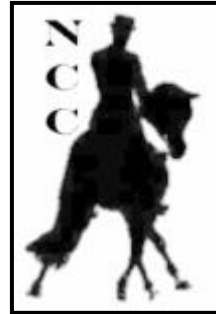
This is the weather for tying your horse outside, standing upwind with a shedding blade, and going to town on all that loose winter hair! Enjoy the sunshine! Happy riding!

- The horse and rider are considered a team for each level of competition.

Recorded Scores

- Minimum of five scores
- All earned scores must be reported by USDF printout.
- Must be from at least three different judges.
- At least one score must be from highest test of level.
- All scores must be from USEF/USDF shows.
- At least three scores must be from an Oklahoma show.
- Riders must submit the USDF printout listing all scores to the awards secretary by mail or fax no later than December 15. ALL scores will be used, not just the top five. Fax # 413-513-0560.
- Following USDF guidelines, all eligible scores will be used to calculate the median score. The median is the middle score when all scores are listed from highest to lowest. For an even number of scores, the two middle scores are averaged.

Year-End Awards will be presented to the following levels:

Introductory (Amateur & Junior division only)
Training (Open, Amateur & Junior division)
First (Open, Amateur & Junior division)
Second (Open, Amateur & Junior division)
Third (Open, Amateur & Junior division)
Fourth (Open, Amateur & Junior division)
FEI (Open, Amateur & Junior division)

Each level will be awarded 1st through 6th place in each division.

One **Vintage Champion** (any rider 50+ years of age) will be awarded for each level.

One **Musical Freestyle Champion** will be awarded covering all levels. This requires a minimum of three scores of 57% or higher.

An overall **Horse-of-the-Year** will be awarded to the horse/rider combination with the highest median regardless of level (excluding musical rides).

A horse/rider combination may not repeat as champion at the same level in succeeding years.

Awards will be presented at the General Meeting or Awards Banquet.

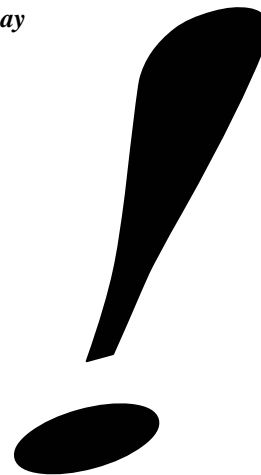
