There are several clinicians that are coming to Oklahoma on a regular basis. Some clinics are closed and some are open.



Reminder: Time for fall shots

I strongly recommend vaccination for West Nile Virus and Influenza in August....even if you vaccinated for them in the spring.

September and October is when cases of West Nile Virus peak. The vaccine is only good for 4-6 months. For protection during the high risk months it is best to vaccinate in August. It's especially important this year since we've had a lot of rain leading to a high mosquito population.

Influenza is another vaccine that is good for only 4-6 months. Several countries require proof of flu vaccination every 6 months in order to show. It's a good idea to vaccinate at least 2 weeks before the first fall show.
