Clinic Format

USEF Announces Rule Change for DR122.5b-e
From the USEF Communications Department
Lexington, Ky. - Please take note of the rule changes effective February 1, 2016 for Dressage Test error calculation (DR 122.5b-e). These changes were made in order to keep USEF rules consistent with the FEI rules for Dressage Test error calculations.
USDF Introductory Level tests and USEF Training Level through Fourth Level tests
In National tests, every "error of the course" whether the bell is sounded or not, must be penalized, except as noted under DR122.5a:

- the first time by 2 points;
- the second time by 4 points;
- the third time the competitor is eliminated.

However, at the discretion of the judge, the rider may continue to finish to test. If the competitor's continued

presence in the ring is about to interfere with the start of the next scheduled ride, then the judge must excuse him/her from the ring.

USEF and FEI Young Horse tests, and FEI Children, Pony Rider and Junior Tests

For these tests, the deduction for an error shall be:

- First error: -0.5% (½ percentage point) from total score received
- Second error: -1.0 % (one percentage point) from total score received
- Third error: Elimination

FEI Young Rider through Grand Prix Tests

In FEI tests (except FEI Children, Pony, Junior, and Young Horse Tests), every "error of the course" whether the bell is sounded or not, must be penalized, except as noted under DR122.5a:

- the first time by 2 percentage points from the total score received;
- the second time by elimination; However, at the discretion of the judge, the rider may continue to finish the test. If the competitor's continued presence in the ring is about to interfere with the start of the next scheduled ride, then the judge must excuse him/her from the ring.

Rider Tests

For Rider test, the deduction for an error shall be:

- First error: Total Score reduced by 0.5 points
- Second error: Total Score reduced by 1.0 points
- Third error: Elimination

My Favorite Things

I have been a Dressage Trainer and Instructor for almost fifty years and for most of that time have run my own business, so over the years I have gathered some experience with what works well and what doesn't. My recommendation this month is for "Ex-Officio Give and Go bikini briefs". Yes, they are fairly expensive but you will agree that they are well worth the cost when you're riding in 100 degrees weather and your underwear stays dry! You will also find that these briefs stay where they are supposed to and the lace top version doesn't give an upper panty line, they also wash beautifully and dry very quickly. I work 12-14 hour days and ride 4-5 horses a day so my underwear gets a good work-out. I have had some of these briefs for at least four years and have not been able to wear them out yet. Ladies and Gentlemen this underwear is comfortable (they make boxers and briefs for the Gents which I hear on good authority from a student's husband are as great as the Ladies versions).

The Road to the US Dressage Finals

I have been competing in the Region 9 Dressage Championships for over 30 years and it seems as though USDF has been talking about a Head to Head National championship for most of that time, so when it was finally announced that it would happen for the first time in 2013 I was definitely keen to qualify and go but fate would have it otherwise. In August of 2013 I was in the ICU with multiple broke bones and internal injuries and although I was riding again by the time of Regional's I was not doing so by the show closing date so I didn't want to risk entering. In 2014 I was healthy and Wandy (Wolkenwand) was going very well at GP so I paid the almost \$1,000 entry fee, then after the closing date Wandy came down with a virus, we were unable to go and I was out a lot of money. My two students Amanda Edwards and Erin Boone were however more fortunate as their mounts had already recovered from the virus and they both did brilliantly and were invited to Nationals. 2015 came around and I had two horses qualified in both open and freestyle classes at second level and GP so it was with much trepidation that I sent in my entry for both horses along with the \$1,600.00 entry fee. As luck would have it we all stayed healthy and the result was two Championships, one Reserve Championship, a third place, one gold medal and one bronze medal with the added bonus that I was invited to compete at the US Dressage finals on both horses along with my student Amanda Edwards on Allouette. Wolkenwand has had a long successful career starting off with the Young Horse Dressage

championships in Kentucky as a five year old so I expected him to qualify and to handle the experience well but my younger horse "Finian"



had just started his showing career earlier in 2015 with his first show ever at Valley View Equestrian Center, Region 9 Championships was his fifth show and Nationals his sixth. Since I bred, raised and trained Finian (by Frohwind) I was incredibly proud of him, he is not a confident horse and he tried very hard to be brave for me. Finian earned a sixth place in the second level freestyle finals class and Wandy was just out of the top ten with an eleventh place in the GP Freestyle and 13th in the GP open. I was very glad to be able to compete and very fortunate to be able to travel with my good friend Amanda. The road trip was uneventful which as anyone pulling a horse trailer on a long trip knows is wonderful and fairly rare however, settling in at the show and life at the campgrounds was not without a few hitches, but that's a story for another day!

Look What's Coming Up in 2016!

Changes to the 2016 Awards/different from those in the directory.

- The awards year will run from October 1, 2015-September 30, 2016. This puts us in line with the national organization as well as making score tabulations easier and allows more time for organizing awards.
- The following are changes to the awards categories:
 - Musical Freestyle will be broken into three categories:
 - Training – Second Level
 - A horse and rider team in this category is eligible to win three times, once per each level within the category. For example: if a horse and rider team wins in Training level, the following year they are not eligible again in Training Level but would be at First Level.
 - Third and Fourth Level
 - A horse and rider team in this category is eligible to win two times, once per each level within the category. For example, if horse and rider team wins in Third level, the following year they are not eligible again in Third Level but would be at Fourth Level.
 - FEI
 - A horse and rider team in this category is eligible to win multiple times, once in Intermediate, the following year they are not eligible again in Intermediate but would be at Grand Prix.
 - Horses competing at Grand Prix are eligible for multiple wins.
 - FEI will also be broken into two categories which will bring us more in line with the division USDF has placed between Intermediate I and Intermediate II.
 - PSG-Intermediate B (JR/YR, AA, Open)
 - Intermediate II and Grand Prix (JR/YR, AA, Open)

Key National Changes for Recognized Shows

- At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhino pneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. See USEF rule GR845 for specifics.
- With the introduction of Intermediate A and B, Intermediate 1 and Intermediate 2 are no longer consecutive levels. Therefore, Intermediate 1 (and Intermediate 1 Freestyle) and Intermediate 2 cannot be shown at the same show. And Intermediate 1 and Intermediate 2 cannot be ridden together at a Regional Championships. There is no plan to hold an Intermediate A/B championship class at this time. This is not new, but a reminder for those planning your qualifying year.
