Protective Headgear Rule Change for Dressage to Go into Effect April 1, 2013

The United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) wishes to remind all dressage competitors of the rule change to DR120. This change goes into effect on April 1, 2013 and necessitates the usage of protective headgear by anyone mounted on the grounds at all USEF dressage competitions.

DR120 has been amended to require protective headgear as follows:

From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.

Horse Slaughter Ban (H.B. 1999/S.B. 375)

US Dressage Finals

The 2013 US Dressage Finals presented by Adequan will be held on November 7-10, 2013 at the Kentucky Horse Park. It will be the first head-to-head competition in dressage showcasing Adult Amateur and Open riders at Training through GP levels who are US citizens. The event will include an Open Division at Training through Grand Prix levels and all Freestyles, as well as an Adult Amateur Division with Training through Grand Prix. Horse/rider combinations who qualify through the nine GAIG/USDF Regional Championships, will have the opportunity to compete on the national stage.

Champions and Reserve Champions who have achieved a minimum score and filed a "Declaration of Intent" will be eligible to compete. "Wild Card" invitations are also available to high-scoring competitors in the Regional Championships who are not otherwise eligible. Grants for Pony Club Riders Available Through The Dressage Foundation

The Trip Harting Fund has been created with donations to The Dressage Foundation from Trip's friends and supporters. This fund will provide grants up to \$500 for a current or graduate rider with a Pony Club Rating of B or A to assist in attending the USDF 'L' Education Program or USDF Instructor Certification Program.

Currently, one annual grant of \$500 is available to the chosen rider, as determined by the Selection Committee. Six (6) complete application sets are due to The Dressage Foundation by March 25th of each year, with selection determined and announced no later than June 1st. Recipients will initially receive \$375 and the remaining \$125 will be distributed once The Dressage Foundation receives a written report upon completion of the Program. The International Dream Program for Advanced Young Riders

The Dressage Foundation's International Dream Program for Young Riders is ready to go for the twelfth year! The concept of the program evolved as a result of former Olympian Michael Poulin's wish to offer an opportunity for gifted Young Riders to enhance their understanding of dressage theory through a European tour. The program is both funded and administered by The Dressage Foundation.

The program is open to USDF Young Riders, riding at Fourth Level or above, who are 16-21 years of age. Also, 22-year-old graduates of the 2012 Advanced Young Rider Program may apply. The tentative dates for the trip have been set for August 5-15, 2013.

The current plan is to visit Ingrid Klimke, Jean Bemelmans, Wolfram Wittig, Matthias Rath, Hubertus Schmidt and former American team coach, Klaus Balkenhol—depending on each trainer's availability. Plans also include attending the CDI in Verden, Germany, which also serves as the World Championship for Young Horses. While traveling, the participants will record their observations in daily journals and chronicle events with photos and video to share with their home dressage organizations.

A Selection Committee comprised of leading American dressage persons selects four candidates based on their applications including an essay, DVD, and written recommendations. Committee members want to see riding proficiency and commitment to training in the sport of dressage.

Conrad Schumacher Clinic Bona B Ranch, Eustace, Texas - February 2, 2013

It could not have been a more beautiful February day to attend the Conrad Schumacher clinic in Eustace, Texas. Eustace is a tiny town, nestled between Ennis and Athens, Texas, almost an hour south of Dallas. The Bona B Ranch is gorgeous facility, and the organizers did a fabulous job setting up this amazing clinic of 12 riders at various levels of training and backgrounds.

It was on a whim that I decided to attend this clinic and I'm so glad that I did! Mr. Schumacher is an amazing clinician. He was wonderfully kind to the riders and their horses. It is quite apparent that he loves what he does, and has a love for the horses. His approach was entirely about the horse. He said time and time again that we need to focus on "Happy Horses".

The clinic was organized with a nice variety of horses and riders at different levels and different backgrounds. There were young horses (4- and 5-year-olds) working at Training and First Level, all the way up to more advanced horses training in the Grand Prix movements. Not all of the horses were Warmbloods. There was also a Fresian and an 8-year-old Quarter Horse stallion that has competed in professional rodeo before being restarted as a Dressage horse.

Mr. Schumacher had an amazing variety of exercises for all the riders. Each rider had to ride over cavalletti at some point in their lesson. He seemed to use the cavalletti to determine how soft and supple the horses were becoming in their work. Cavalletti work was done at the walk, trot. and canter. For the young horses, he used a lot of walk-trot transitions to focus their attention on the riders. Serpentines were followed by canter, walk, and trot transitions for all levels of riders and horses. The horses were ridden forward, not in a running fashion, but balanced with energy. "The horse needs to be quick enough to open up, but slow enough to control the movements."

A lot of focus was spent on keeping the necks of the horses straight and long enough for the horse to move easily and without tension. The horses must be round into the contact. "If the neck is stuck up high, then the horse cannot do anything, it makes him stuck in his body. We have to train the horse to use his body in the easiest way—and the easiest way is to have the neck round and soft."

Mr. Schumacher spent a lot of time talking about making the aids invisible. Having quiet hands and quiet aids, but still being effective through the use of softening the shoulders and feeling the horse in the shoulders, rather than stiff arms or elbows. We should have solid contact, but that means that the contact is not strong but steady. The shoulders are the key. Mr. Schumacher gave the example of thinking about our shoulders as the donut in side reins. "When your shoulders are relaxed they act as the donut, they give a release to the horse when the horse needs it. When the shoulders are stiff, then the horse is not able to take a release." We should have our shoulders relaxed, fists shut, and sit quietly with relaxed hips.

Mr. Schumacher mentioned that Dressage riders need to do everything with both sides of the body. If the right hand gives, then the left hand takes. We have to learn how to sit properly, then we have to learn the aids, then we have to learn how to combine the two. Not an easy task, but the exercises that were demonstrated helped pave the way to achieving that goal.

What really stuck out was how the riders all seemed to be in perfect harmony with their horses. Listening to what the horses gave them, and then using their bodies in a way to redirect their energy and bring out the best their horses had to offer.

It was truly an amazing clinic, and I felt that I learned so much that I could apply to my own riding. The riders and horses were all just fantastic, and it was great to see such soft, happy and relaxed horses. I truly recommend the drive to Dallas to see Mr. Schumacher teach! It was a fun clinic and Mr. Schumacher taught in such a way that anyone at any level of riding could apply his exercises to their own program.
