

### A FOCUS ON TRAINING: The Thoughtful Rider

### Life Force Energy

Energy is so crucial in our daily lives. In addition to helping us make sense of the entire universe, the story of our lives revolves around how to harness and understand this energy and the relationship of how its philosophy and mechanics work. This living force or energy is the same for dressage horse and if harnessed there is unimaginable grace and power in the flow of energy. And within the different exercises it is that life force energy that is transformed from one form to another.

It is for this very reason that modern dressage, with its shortened necks and neck manipulations as a form of elasticizing the horse makes no sense and goes contrary to every principle known with the rest of life. Instead, it locks the poll and the horse is unable to turn its head left or right. It prevents the aids and impulsion to go through, creating stiffness in other parts of the body as well as numbness and tension in the mind.

The neck belongs to the horse in its entirety with a soft poll to allow for a swinging back and for the hind legs to step under the center of gravity. The idea is the harnessing of energy in the partnership with the horse and not of submissiveness and dominance. We need to get back to riding the horse from the hind legs, where the energy is found, to the front, where the energy is harnessed.

## **ODS Bylaws Change Regarding Officers Up For Vote**

At the 2018 ODS Summer Meeting, the following proposed Bylaws change will be voted upon. All ODS members are encouraged to attend the meeting and vote upon these changes. The wording to be considered for revision is highlighted in red below.

#### **Article VIII Officers**

Current wording: Section 2: **Duties and Authority** 

B. In the absence of the President, or in the event of the President's inability or refusal to act, the Vice President shall perform the duties and have the authority of the President. The Vice President shall perform such other duties as the President and/or the Board of Director's may assign. The Vice President is the President-elect fo the following year. The Board reserves the right to re-elect the President and Vice-President for a second term if agreed to by the President and Vice-President. (Reviewed 2017)sdfsdf

Proposed Changes: Section 2: **Duties and Authority** 

B. In the absence of the President, or in the event of the President's inability or refusal to act, the Vice President shall perform the duties and have the authority of the President. The Vice President shall perform such other duties as the President and/or the Board of Director's may assign. *No one should be president unless they have served on the board for at least one year.*

## Teams Announced for 2018 USDF North American Youth Dressage Championships

Lexington, KY (July 20, 2018) – The United States Dressage Federation<sup>™</sup> (USDF) is pleased to announce the riders that will represent the United States in the USDF North American Youth Dressage Championships, held during the 2018 Adequan®/FEI North American Youth Championships, presented by Gotham North (NAYC). The championships will be held August 1.5 at Old Selam Farm in North Selam NV. A total of 40 youth from

will be held August 1-5 at Old Salem Farm, in North Salem, NY. A total of 42 youth, from across the country, will compete. The NAYC is the premier equestrian competition in North America for youth, age 14-21. Young equestrians vie for team and individual FEI medals in the three Olympic equestrian disciplines of show jumping, dressage, and eventing, the Paralympic discipline of para-dressage, and the FEI World Equestrian Games disciplines of reining and endurance. The competition is run under rules of the FEI (Federation Equestre Internationale), the international governing body for equestrian sport, and is the only FEI championship held annually on this continent.

"NAYC is the culmination of a lot of hard work for our youth riders across the country. As a team competition, it fosters sportsmanship at the highest level for these young people within our sport. I'm very proud of all of the volunteers, parents, and riders who have put this together, and I'm looking forward to seeing them there!" said Roberta Williams, USDF FEI Jr/ YR Committee Chair.



### <u>Of Life And Horses: The Nature Of The Horse</u> by Ann Nyberg Bradley

*Of Life and Horses is more than a primer on equine behavior. It is a comprehensive look into understanding the nature of horses and attaining* 

harmony with these magnificent beings. As much as society tends to describe horses with one definition, the truth is that each horse, like each human, is individual. Those of us who desire to understand horses and develop personal relationships with them - the kind of harmony that is sustainable and satisfying - must learn to




understand equine nature. Author Ann Bradley approaches this subject with one strong purpose: that readers find harmony and unity with their equine companions. So much of how we approach a horse is based on our observations. The more we observe. . . and understand. . . the more successful that relationship will be. Despite the perception, each horse has its particular intellect and complexity of character. How do horses see their world - literally as well as figuratively? What makes them do the things they do? How can we develop a means of communication with an animal so different in nature from ourselves? These questions and so many more are addressed in Of Life and Horses. The Principles of Riding provides a complete instruction course of horse and rider using the German training system — a system that has consistently produced international champions for many decades. The emphasis is on an integral approach to the interaction between horse and rider. It all depends on harmony between horse and rider. The correct seat and the appearance of the horse under the rider are regarded as the result of correct riding.

### Seabiscuit - by Laura Hillenbrand

Laura Hillenbrand, author of the runaway phenomenon *Unbroken*, brilliantly recreates a universal underdog story in this #1 *New York Times* bestseller.

Seabiscuit was one of the most electrifying and popular attractions in sports history and the single biggest newsmaker in the world in 1938, receiving more coverage than FDR, Hitler, or Mussolini. But his success was a surprise to the racing establishment, which had written off the crooked-legged racehorse with the sad tail. Three men changed Seabiscuit's fortunes:



Charles Howard was a onetime bicycle


repairman who introduced the automobile to the western United States and became an overnight millionaire. When he needed a trainer for his new racehorses, he hired Tom Smith, a mysterious mustang breaker from the Colorado plains. Smith urged Howard to buy Seabiscuit for a bargainbasement price, then hired as his jockey Red Pollard, a failed boxer who was blind in one eye, half-crippled, and prone to quoting passages from Ralph Waldo Emerson. Over four years, these unlikely partners survived a phenomenal run of bad fortune, conspiracy, and severe injury to transform Seabiscuit from a neurotic, pathologically indolent also-ran into an American sports icon.
