

On May  $8^{th}$  &  $9^{th}$ , 2021, The Oklahoma Dressage Society will again host its United States Dressage Federation Annual Horse Show at Expo Square in Tulsa, OK.

This show is recognized as a premier equestrian event and draws exhibitors from around the region including Arkansas, Missouri, Kansas, and Texas. In 2019 ODS's horse show drew over one hundred horse and rider combinations, thirty sponsors and two hundred spectators who came together to support, compete and socialize. This year, Covid rules will take precedence.

The Oklahoma Dressage Society is a 501(c)(3) Charitable Organization. Today, dressage encompasses training that is used with various other equine activities including, but not limited to, jumping, driving and pleasure riding. There are many therapeutic benefits when incorporating horses with children (handicapped to autistic) and veterans (injured to PTSD). With the recent addition of "Western" Dressage, the influence of dressage has seen great growth.



#### Why Are Horseshoes Considered Lucky?

A Saint Patrick's Day staple, horse shoes have long been associated with good luck although there's an ongoing debate over the proper way to use them when attempting to attract good fortune.

From the horseshoe necklace Carrie Bradshaw wore in the "Sex and the City" movie to the horseshoe-shape purple marshmallows in Lucky Charms cereal, the superstitious symbols have a solid presence in popular culture. Their popularity as lucky emblems dates back for centuries, when they were used to ward off evil goblins.

According to ancient folklore, small-framed "fairy folk" existed during the Stone Age across what is now Northern Europe and the British Isles. When migrating Celtic tribes began invading the lands around 400 BC, the fairies hid in forests and camouflaged themselves by wearing green much like today's leprechauns. The new settlers told stories about the mysterious, magical "little people" living in the woods, who were also referred to as elves and goblins.

The goblins were accused of causing many misfortunes among the settlers, from casting spells to prevent cows from giving milk and chickens from laying eggs to causing infertility in couples. Legends also told of babies kidnapped by the fairies. It was

believed that the primitive goblins feared the metal weapons of their enemies, and were therefore afraid of iron.

To ward off goblins and evil spirits from their homes, the people hung iron horseshoes over their front doors. "Horseshoes were doubly frightening to the little people because they looked like the Celtic moon god's crescent," Donald E. Dossey states in his book, "Holiday Folklore, Phobias, and Fun."

Although the lucky emblem's status has survived over the centuries, there's still some debate over the proper way to position a horseshoe in order to repel bad fortune: Some believe that a horseshoe with the two ends pointing up collects good luck and keeps it from falling out, while other traditions state that the two ends should point downward so that luck pours onto those who walk through the door.

#### **New Virtual Show Opportunity For Classic & Western Dressage!**




Our member Gail Matheus, from Kansas, has come up with an innovative idea and created **Spotlight Horse Shows**, which is offering a series of virtual shows. She is using this platform to help GMOs generate some income while offering Virtual showing across the nation! When a GMO attaches its name to one of her shows, she does the work of registering rides, collecting videos, contracting judges, and sending out awards. In return, with no investment, the GMO receives \$10/ride, regardless of whether the riders are members of that GMO. Spotlight Horse Shows offers Traditional tests from Intro up to FEI Levels, and tests are judged by "S" Judges. They also off the full array of WDAA Tests, judged by WD Recognized Judges, and these virtual tests will Qualify for the WDAA World Championships! In addition, Spotlight will conduct their own virtual Regional Championships and National Finals. (Note: These are *only* for the Spotlight series; they *do not* qualify for live USDF Regional or National shows)

Your Board has discussed this and decided to put our name on a show titled "Beat the Heat Show"! The opening date for entries is June 17, 2021 ~ closing on July 7. Once you enter, you will receive an official video sign from Gail which will need to be displayed at the beginning of a ride, to ensure that the ride is specifically for this show. 

#### Tex-Over Farms CDI\*\* **Houston Dressage Spring Classic**

April 30- May 4, 2021

Region 9 is very proud to be one of the few regions outside of Florida and California that hosts a CDI. Thanks to HDS for organizing and to Tex-Over Farms for sponsoring the event this year! Got questions?.....check out the Q & A below.

All riders who are planning to qualify for the NAYC or for the USEF National Championships in any of the junior divisions or in the U25 Grand Prix are encouraged to participate in this event.

#### What is a CDI?

CDI stands for 'Concours de Dressage International' and it is a show that is conducted according to FEI rules. The FEI or Fédération Équestre Internationale is the international governing body for equestrian sport while the USEF is our national governing body. A CDI only offers 'FEI' classes which will include GP, Intermediaire, Prix St Georges, FEI Junior and Young Riders, and the FEI Children's and Pony classes. Many times there will be a national show running concurrently with the CDI, and it will offer the other classes that we are used to seeing at our shows. A rider who is riding in the CDI may not enter the national show with the same horse.

#### Why is it important to participate?

Competing at a CDI is an important learning experience. Many of the rules are different in a CDI. Its good to have the opportunity to learn what is expected from riders at a CDI before getting to an FEI championship like the NAYC.

#### Will my scores count toward NAYC qualifying?

Scores may be used for NAYC qualifying at the discretion of the athlete. Scores must be submitted via the USEF CDI and Championship Report Form within the specified deadline stated on the form to count toward qualifying.

#### What rules are different?

There are a number rules that are different for FEI competitions including permitted equipment and medications for both horse and rider. It's a good idea to get familiar with the FEI rule book and discuss any questions that you have with your trainer.

#### What is a jog?

The purpose of the jog along with the in-stall inspection is to positively identify your horse and to evaluate its soundness and fitness to compete.

#### Does my horse need a passport?

Yes, your horse will need either an FEI passport or a national passport. Certain vaccinations must be documented on the passport so please allow 8 to 10 weeks for this process. Learn more here.
