



Winterizing Barn Hacks - Be Prepared!

Investing in some time now to prepare for the cold months ahead will save you headaches later. Here are some barn hacks that will help both you and your fuzzy friends.

- · Invest in heated water buckets or poly insulated bucket holders.
- Foam pool noodles are great for quick insulation on pipes and hoses, plus they double as cord protection.
- Use plastic jugs or bottles filled with a high solution of salt water to help prevent ice formation in water buckets and troughs. To make salt water jugs: 1. Collect plastic jugs or bottles with screw-top caps; 2. Fill each jug with lots of salt (use more than you think—the higher concentration of salt, the lower the temperature required to freeze it!) and fill jug with warm water (warm water helps dissolve salt better); 3. Close the lid and shake each jug to dissolve the salt; 4. Toss jugs into water buckets or troughs (bigger troughs get more jugs).
- Increase your horse's salt intake in encourage them to drink more water. Also, always clean your waterer or bucket, regardless of the outside temperature, to encourage them to drink. Research shows that horses increase their water intake by 40%/day when water temps were above freezing during cold weather...aim for water between 45-65 degrees.
- For snow removal, spray a snow shovel with horse hair polish, cooking oil or mane & tail detangler to prevent snow from sticking to the shovel
- Buy a pair of hunter's mittens to use when wanting to keep fingers warm while doing chores but need access to your digits. These are the type of glove that has a mitten topper that flips back very handy when fiddling with buckles, latches and nozzles in the winter.
- Coat the freshly picked out hoofs with grooming oil or cooking spray to prevent snowballs from forming.
- If you need warm water for washing bits, buckets or tack, take a crockpot to the barn with you to keep water toasty!
- The hair coat insulates the horse by trapping and warming air. A wet, matted or muddy hair coat will reduce its insulating value and increase heat loss. Keep dry shelter available and groom a dirty or wet horse to replenish its insulating properties.

The Art of Horsemanship ... From A Cat's Point Of View

I can easily get my human servant to play with me later if I wanted to get her some exercise. I'm liking the snuggling effect right now. Snuggling in the warmth also allows me to do some Cat philosophizing. I like to figure out how things work......especially my humans. 
