USDF Convention Report

As you may have heard, this year's Convention was shifted from live to virtual at, literally, the last minute, about one month before the event. Lisa Goretta, the outgoing President, and her Board made that difficult decision, wishing to err on the side of safety for all involved. While disappointing in many ways, going virtual did open the Convention to more interested members not having to travel. I was the ODS Delegate, and as such attended as a voting representative to the Board of Governors meetings on both Friday and Saturday. It is impressive to realize the magnitude of responsibility the officials of USDF must manage. Most positions are held by volunteers, and there are also many paid staff members who keep the dressage wheels rolling on a nationwide basis.

The biggest news was that George Williams was nominated from the floor for the position as President, and he accepted. As a result, Kevin Renig withdrew his name from that candidacy, leaving George and Steve Schubert running for that position. George won in a virtual landslide, so the guidance of USDF is once again in the well experienced hands for their former President.

There were some interesting numbers that were shared:

- Region 9 Championships had 314 horses and ran 6 arenas! This is the third highest number in 17 years

- The Houston CDI had 29 entries. This is the only CDI offered in the middle of the country!
- USDF had 26, 747 members in 2021
- -13,404 horses were competing in 2021 (this is more than competed in 2019)
- There were over 85,000 rides! (more than 2019)
- 2476 competitors rode at Regional Championships
- 567 competitors rode at the Finals in Kentucky
- USDF provided over \$37,000 in Travel Grants for the Kentucky competitors

A new awards level was proposed and passed. This will be "Medals of Distinction" for Bronze, Silver, and Gold Medals. To achieve "Distinction", riders' scores must be 67% or greater. Regular Medal scores will remain at 60%. USDF will be formally announcing this soon, so watch for updates to the Medal program.

Fun Facts: The 2021 Holiday Season



Holiday Celebrations

This festive season is a time for gathering and celebrating with family and friends, gift giving, reflection, and thanks. To commemorate this time of year, the U.S. Census Bureau presents the following holiday-related facts and figures from its vast collection of statistics.

Holiday Decorations

China led the way with approximately—**9 out of 10**, or **92 percent** (\$1.9 billion) of U.S. imports of Christmas ornaments in 2020.

Cambodia led the way with approximately—**6 out of 10**, or **60 percent** (\$278 million) of U.S. imports of Christmas tree lights in 2020.

Vietnam led the way with approximately—**5 out of 10**, or **54 percent** (\$378 million) of U.S. imports of tapered candles in 2020.






