


Originally from Germany, outside Dusseldorf, Liselotte (Lilo) Fore is the former owner of "Sporthorse America" in Santa Rosa, California for which she has been honored for her major role in raising the quality dressage training and horses to an international level. She served as an FEI 5 Star judge; in that capacity she has been a member of the Ground Jury for numerous international competitions such as the Word Cup final in Las Vegas, Olympics, Pan American Games, and World Equestrian Games including WEG in Normandy. She is among the founders and served as chair of the USDF Instructor-Trainer Certification Program. She is continuously involved in many educational programs for Dressage trainers, teachers and judges throughout the United States. Among countless accolades and awards, in 2017, Lilo was inducted into the Roemer Foundation/USDF Hall of Fame for her contribution to the sport of dressage in the United States. Though now FEI 5*retired, she had the privilege to serve on the Olympics in Tokyo on the JSP Panel, (Judges Supervising Panel).



ODS Hosts USDF "L" Program

Why is ODS considering engaging on this Program a very ambitious task? We as a club had actually agreed to do this back in January 2020 at the AGM. The Education Committee proposed it to the membership present, it was enthusiastically received and voted on. Well, we all know what happened in 2020.... nothing. Programs elsewhere in the country were cancelled as everything shut down. We were uncertain as to how things would open up in 2021, and now we feel confident that we can move forward with planning. ODS first presented the "L" Program in 2000, which is when most of the current "L"s graduated. We felt it had so much value, we did it again in 2010, and it seems good timing to bring it out again. We are excited to also embark on a groundbreaking innovative way to put the Program on ~ a collaboration between three area GMOs. We approached CPDS (who had mentioned they were looking into this Program) and our friends up in Wichita, KDEA. The Presidents, educators, and interested supporters had conversations about how it could/would work, and we came to an agreement that is exciting to us all. USDF is also excited and interested in watching this work, as it has never been presented this way before. We hope it can be an inspiration for other smaller GMOs so that the burden of hosting the Sessions is shared three ways.

What are the benefits of putting this on?

 Anyone interested in showing (or just riding better) can benefit from learning the methodology of judging, what the judges are trained to look for, how they are taught to evaluate tests and come up with standardized scores. Ever wonder why you got a 6 and the horse behind you got an 8? This is the place to learn about that.



- It is open to all riders of any level, amateur or open, and the focus is on the lower levels of Intro, Training, First and Second. This is a premier educational opportunity for auditors!
- We will be looking for demonstration riders. This is an opportunity to ride, at *no charge* for USDF Judges who comprise the "L" faculty, learning about your own horses, how to improve your rides, without the pressure or expense of a clinic or show.
- ODS only has four active "L"Graduates to service all our schooling shows. Those four also are requested at shows in Kansas, Texas and Arkansas. If local "L"s cannot be found the shows have to bear the expense of bringing out-of-state judges. The current "L"s need a break and 'new blood' needs to be out there!
- Having spoken with the USDF Education Coordinator, we found that there are currently no plans for an "L" Program anywhere in the Midwest, meaning we will certainly have a good selection of Candidates applying to participate in the Program, which will assure financial security.
- Auditing this Program will provide all "L"s in the area their required Continuing Education, enabling them to improve their skills.

Remembering Charlotte Kerr

You will have to go back a couple of decades into the history of ODS to remember the bright, sweet spirit of Charlotte Kerr. A Charter member of ODS, Charlotte was a definite presence, actively participating in ODS shows and events, and taking her turn as President in volunteering her time and efforts for club growth and progress. Charlotte moved to Oklahoma in January of 1974 to attend Oklahoma University, graduating in 1977 with a BS in Nutrition. She was a lifelong lover of equestrian sports, riding in rodeos, Hunter/Jumper divisions, and finally settling into Dressage. Lee Ann Alf recalls that she took her very first Dressage lesson

with Charlotte on December
15. 1989!

Charlotte 'rode West' on December 22, 2021 in Albuquerque, NM after a two year episode with lung cancer that, her obituary said, she fought privately, fiercely, and gracefully. She leaves an empty space in the hearts of her extended family, as well as those of us who knew her in the early years of Dressage in Oklahoma.

From Where Do The Dressage Arena Letters Originate? By: HowToDressage.com

What are the origins of the dressage arena letters?

Being able to supply the answer to this question is a good way to astound your horsey friends with your knowledge of trivia, as it's not something many dressage riders are familiar with.

We've done the research so that you can take all the credit!

What do the dressage arena letters mean?

The definitive origin of the dressage arena letters is unknown, but there are two main theories, both of which originate in Germany.

Theory 1

Before 1918, markings were seen on the walls of the stable yard of the Royal Manstall, the Imperial German Court in Berlin. The marks indicated where each horse was positioned by its groom to await its rider. This was essential, as the Manstall housed 300 of the Kaiser's horses.

The yard itself was called the "Hof," and it was large enough to allow riders to assemble and parade for morning exercise. The yard measured roughly 20 meters by 60 meters, the size of a modern long dressage arena.

So, the letters marked on the walls of the Hof indicated the following [listed alphabetically]:

A	Ausgang	Exit
В	Bannertrager	Standard Bearer
E	Edeling/Ehrengast	Chieftan or Honored Guest
F	Fürst	Prince
Н	Hofsmarshall	Lord Chancellor
K	Kaiser	Emperor
M	Meier	Steward
P	Pferknecht	Ostler or Groom
R	Ritter	Knight
S	Schzkanzler	Chancellor of the Exchequer
v	Vassal	Servant/Squire/Equerry

That sounds like a reasonable theory, all but for the absence of the letter C.

Theory 2

The second theory involves the German cavalry.

The space between the stable blocks in the German cavalry barracks measured 20 meters by 60 meters and was used for general assembly and morning exercise.

It would be logical to assume that the cavalry would adopt similar markings to that of their predecessors in the Kaiser's Court. However, in the German cavalry manual that was first published in 1882, you will see a diagram of the indoor exercise arena, the Reit Bahn, shown as measuring 40 meters by 20 meters.

In the Riet Bahn, the letters are shown as A, B, C, and D in each corner of the arena, and E and F as the middle markers on the long sides. These letters were used as a guide for riders as they practiced the school figures in training, rather than for competitions.

5 Reasons Why Your Horse Should Have A Special Cat Friend

cat "paw-losophies!"

Purrrrring in January! This begins the real season of staying where it's warm & cozy. Make sure to pick your favorite friend to snuggle with & keep those blankets warm.

This month is also the first to celebrate the special relationships cats have with horses. If you don't have at least one of us frisky, friendly felines in your pack of 4-leggeds, then you AND your equine are missing out on something really special. Here are...

...5 Reasons Why Your Horse Should Have a Special Relationship with a Cat. (A.K.A. Why Cats & Horses Make Purrfect Friends.)

#5 The first thing that everyone thinks of is: MOUSE!!!!!!

Well, I'm here to let you know that not all cats have an affinity for making sure that the little beady-eyed things stay out of the horse's grain. I may like to rocket around my own little world, but don't expect me to touch a mouse. That's a BIG iffy. I will chase the little bugger, but bite its little head off? YUCK!!!!! I leave those kinds of messy jobs for my much more practiced older sister, Layla. She's always leaving little trophies for my human so I don't have to.

#4 Shining your horse's nose.

Some of you may think of this as nose-rubbing; but, that's such an in-elegant way to think of this purrfect service that your horse's special buddy performs for them. There is no doubt that this is a JOB! That nose is pretty darn big when you really think about it. Sometimes that enormous nose can be covered with wet stuff or prickly hay parts. Ever gotten hit by a wet, mash-covered, enormous nose? A double YUCK!!!! Warning: You've got to remember to wait for your horse buddy to ask for it though. I've been introduced to the controversial **MARE personality** when I've proceeded with a nose shine without being given permission. WOW! That was NOT an elegant landing. (It did provide quite a few laughs from the peon gallery.) Often, if you have a willing partner, a really nice side benefit is that I get my nose shined, too!

#3 Washing your horse's face.

This is a much more pleasant job for all concerned & usually morphs out of a beginning nose shine. My horse buddy loves it. He will stick his nose right in my face when I'm sitting on the fence post sunning myself. Now, he can be a real bother about it, especially if I'm getting some much needed rays. That sun feels soooo good on a brisk winter afternoon. Pushing me off the post or blocking my sun can be cause for a paw swipe on occasion. Usually, I'm happy to oblige my special pal & wet his nose with my tongue. Actually, he tastes pretty good. I often get a return favor. You should try it some time.

#2 Horse Back Massage

Kneading. Percussive muscle stimulation. Acupuncture. Major techniques of a good therapeutic massage for the big one. Sometimes accompanied by purring or little soft meows, your horse will LOVE you for bringing this daily ritual into their life. Wouldn't you like to have a back massage every day? Think of what it would do for your riding partner, especially if we've been pounding around on their back for a while. All cats are experts at these special techniques, although some have been known to get too enthusiastic with the acupuncture. We all like to be healthy & taken care of. I know I do!

#1 Personal Back Warmer

Why is this my number 1? Think about it. Close your eyes. Imagine warming your back with your own special friend. Feel that warmth flow not only throughout your back but also through your heart. Doesn't that sound like the most

excellent way to spend time on any day? Transfer that image to seeing your horse standing in the winter sun with their own cat blanket in the middle of their back. Sometimes, an unspoken agreement has been reached where your horse needs some special warmth on top of their hips. We cats are only too willing to oblige when it comes to the special relationship we have with our horse buddies. We love the warmth of a big (or small) back to snuggle with. Cozy. Purrrrrrr....

Having one, two..... or more..... Felines around the barn can also be great motivators in getting horses moving. Cats under-foot are great at initiating high trot steps, fancy footwork & large cantering leaps for horses. Use your friendly feline as instruments for practicing balance, leg yields & pirouettes for both horses & humans.

Ooops. My human says I've listed more than 5..... well, apparently I'm not very good with math cause I could keep my list growing. How many more reasons could YOU add to my list? Let me know how your horses & cats make their relationship special. I'm waiting with slanted eyes & perfect purrrrrs to hear from you & your 4-legged friends.





Important Dressage Rule Changes Effective December 1, 2021

by U.S. Equestrian Communications Department | Nov 2, 2021

Lexington, Ky. – US Equestrian (USEF) Dressage has several rule changes approved for the 2022 competition year, including a complete rewrite to DR120 – Dress, effective December 1, 2021. The changes to DR120 will modernize many of the dress code rules, keeping familiar traditional attire in the rule while giving riders many more choices and flexibility, to suit their modern tastes, fabrics and color choices for the competition arena. The provisions of this section apply to all classes and levels, including Championships, at USEF-Licensed, USDF-recognized dressage competitions. CDI riders should continue to look to FEI Dressage Chapter rules for attire permitted in International Events.

A complete list of the approved rule changes, including the DR120 rewrite, can be found here (https://www.usef.org/forms-pubs/202-Diz02rc/rule-changes-approved-by-board-of).

Also effective December 1, 2021, is Annex B (https://www.usef.org/forms-pubs/ TvTzJ fOwc/annex-b), which outlines the requirements for US athletes to enter CDIs (FEI Competitions). These requirements will be checked once an athlete completes the FEI entry portal for a CDI. 
