Spring Symposium Report

ODS did it again! We brought in another internationally recognized presenter for another successful Symposium! **Lilo Fore** was in great form as she guided 19 horses and riders through patterns and exercises designed to improve and refine their performance. She frequently explained what she was looking for, that little extra something, little more forward here, more balance there, lightness now, shorter reins for better connection. Through explaining to the riders, she let the auditors know what she was after, what she knew could be a little more, a little better. Occasionally she would get sharp in her tone, and then say, "Oops! That was my German voice!", and would laugh to take any sting out of what she had said. Lilo, as would be expected of someone with her background, experience and training, adapted her teaching demands according to level of horse or rider. With lower level or amateur riders, she patiently took time to gently mold them into better performers. As horses and riders became more experienced, her standards became stricter and expectations higher. She was demanding, encouraging, and she had a clear idea of what she wanted the horses and riders to be doing to be not only correct, but fair to the horses.

What a great experience for all of us!

Some of Lilo's pearls of wisdom:

* I want horses to work from a place of balance. I want them to develop correctly up the levels, that they can do exercises but not worry as they try new ones. Sometimes they have to work through their issues. You have to play with the combinations to see where they can go.



- * We have to find helpful ways to help improve and make positive changes. Don't ever say "you must!" You have to allow the horse to tell you what is the best way to be fair to both horse and rider. Find places to make the horse better.
- *BALANCE is really what dressage is all about. You have to balance and educate their natural gaits!!
- *See what's in front of you and feel what's behind you!!

A thousand "thanks" to Lilo for gracing us with her knowledge and great company. And to all those who made this possible: Pamela Byers for hours of organization, Sherry Guess and Marta Koenig (and granddaughter, Ramona) for arena set up, Nancy Trait-Lira for barn management, and the countless others who helped with their encouragement. Thanks also goes to the riders who put themselves out there in public, and thanks to the auditors who made the effort to expand their education.

Finally, thanks goes to USDF for their guidance and support, and offer of the GMO Initiative Grant. It is a big group effort, and such a rewarding feeling to see it all come to pass!




It's Show Time! ODS Spring Show Update

On The Lilo Fore Symposium

I want to thank Oklahoma Dressage Society for their continuing commitment to dressage education. Sunday, we wrapped up the Lilo Fore Symposium at the Tulsa Expo. It was well attended by auditors who had a broad spectrum of quality demo riders and their horses to watch and learn from. Lilo was entertaining, insightful and to the point with each horse and rider.

I brought my 9-year-old granddaughter. She has been riding my Haflinger pony the last several years and is starting to show him this year. My objective in bringing her was to help her see in action some of the concepts we have been talking about as she rides. Saturday evening, we went home after a full day of watching horses and riders and saddled up. We talked about the strong, ground covering trots we had watched that day and compared it to the little pony trot Basil usually gives her. He is kind and obedient with her, but pokey. So when I called out, "more!, more!," she had a concept of what a forward trot looks like, and she produced it! For me that was worth the price of admission. But that's not all.

One thing Lilo said that made a big impression on me was, "ROUND IS NOT DOWN!!!" Then she gave a concise description of what being "on the bit" really is. Short reins, close the fist, bend the elbows and use the legs to send the horse forward to the bit. Today I had the opportunity to get on my horses and try it out. I have been struggling (unconsciously) with the image that round is down. Today when I applied Lilo's words to my position along with the mental examples that I had watched all weekend, my horses thanked me with joyful forwardness.

So, thank you Lilo for willingly sharing your expertise. Thank you, Oklahoma Dressage Society for your commitment to dressage education. And thank all of you leaders and members who gave of their time and talent to wrestle with the mountain of details and heavy lifting it takes to put on an event that can change understandings and ridden outcomes. There are so many things that go on with our members outside of what we know about them related to horse activities. Two things came to our attention this past month.



She had been a teacher in the Houston school system for years, and then took extensive training in laser work on horses, developing a successful and gratifying business serving horses in need. She left all that to move back to Oklahoma to be near her mother and family. She took a position in the Copan School system teaching 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades, and facing the challenges of a small, underfunded rural school. She dealt with many things, COVID included, and worked to bring a higher level of professionalism and commitment to her classes. Happily, her efforts were recognized and she was named *Copan Public Schools Teacher of the Year!* We can all be proud of this unsung hero (as all teachers are), dedicated to educating the children and giving them a greater prospect for their futures.

Member **Jennifer Brittain** has a busy full-time job, and yet has volunteered her time three afternoons a week for 8 weeks to work with a group of children in an after school enrichment program as part of the Pryor School system. Students are learning about daily horse care, grooming, anatomy, nutrition, veterinary care, hoof care, tack, equine therapies, a variety of equine sports and disciplines, and horse behavior. A consistent focus on horse behavior and horse/human communication and cooperation is taught throughout the course.



Feline Exercises for The Equestrian Sport: Same As Humans

Meow to everyone. Ms. Rocket knows what time of year it is. It's April! It's Spring! And you know what springtime brings to creatures of all kinds? Mmmmrooow...... time to get in shape for riding!

I've already started my daily exercise routine. Every morning, I jump up on the counter by the garage door and sit tall like a statue. The first exercise in my series. Holding still uses every muscle that I have, even in my ears and eyes. I'll even check my balance by elegantly lifting one of my back paws. That paw then reaches the precise level so I can slowly reach with my tongue and use that to clean my back claws or between my back toes. Have you tried that this morning? Balance is very important when riding your favorite equine.

Then, I'll begin the second set of exercises in my daily Getting In Shape routine. I first turn my eyes, then my nose with my ears following. This movement trickles down through my head to my neck and into my upper torso. The movement continues to slide down my spine to rotate my ribs in the same direction and complete my spiral while leaving my pelvis and legs in the exact same position they began. Now I can see down the hallway to the door. Feel the stretch in the opposite hip and how it connects all the way through the torso and up the neck through to the top of the head between the ears? You should always stretch before riding your favorite equine.

To begin the third set of exercises, I bring the top of my pelvis, followed by my hips, and facilitated by the pushing off of my outside hind paw while supporting myself on my inside hind. This all begins the lengthening of both hind legs and the un-spiraling of the spine. Don't forget that mini-half-halt on that inside hind to keep that foot in place underneath the center of gravity and your seat. Now you're in the perfect position to ready yourself for that "leap of faith." Always remember to keep your core lengthening in preparation for mounting your favorite equine.

The fourth set of exercises begins with the gathering of the power of the hind legs underneath your balanced seat. Remember your balance, the stretch of lengthening those legs, and the strength of your core to maintain control as

your body moves. Your favorite equine places themselves squared in front of you with their broad, flat back level with your launching pad and POUNCE! The timing must be perfect as you settle into the saddle while your riding partner is tying her shoes.

NEW DEADLINE FOR FALL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS: April 21, 2022

This second **30 days before the event deadline** has been initiated by the ODS Board & the ODS Scholarship Committee because of the 2022 joint sponsorship of the USDF "L" Program, Part 1 and the three (3) sessions that event will include. The ODS Scholarships are available only for ODS members in good standing.

Part 1 of the USDF "L" Program consists of both classroom sessions (lectures and videos) and live demonstrations. The program takes a systematic and orderly approach to explaining the judge's methodology. It examines bio-mechanics of the horse's gaits and the rider's position; the scoring system; appropriate comments; and, how the horse properly demonstrates the basics through the first three levels of dressage (Training through Second Level). Individuals may register as Participants or Auditors. Participants are granted access to training materials and homework on the USDF website. Auditors are also provided information on the website, but do not need to complete homework. Auditors are able to listen and view the entire program, but are not permitted to ask questions unless time permits.

Session A will take place May 21-22, at Rogers State University in Claremore, and Rocking C Ranch in Inola, OK. Session B will take place July 30-31, at Valley View Equestrian Center in Stillwater, OK. Session C will take place October 15-16 at Capall Stables in Wichita, KS.

GCDC Show Update: Postponed to June 2023

The difficult decision was made by the GCC Board to cancel this year's GCDC Show on March 12, 13. Even with a strong phone campaign to encourage entries, there just were not enough to make the show financially feasible. The rough February weather seemed a big deterrent, with many riders and trainers feeling they just did not have their horses up to show condition. GCC did not have the financial depth to take a loss on the show, and there was concern about how the cancellation penalties would affect them. Through the good grace of the two judges, Charlotte Trentleman and Judy Downer, neither are charging a penalty fee, nor are the TD or announcer, so that helps GCC save quite a bit of money. After a discussion with the ODS Show committee (Roberta Clark, Sherry Guess, Anne Kuhns) and Kara Garde, GCC President, the ODS Board voted to take on responsibility for GCDC in 2023, and return to a June date at the Claremore Expo! So this fine show, with an over 20-year history, will be back! Tentative date: **June 10 - 11, 2023**

The ODS Education Scholarship provides financial assistance to Oklahoma Dressage members to further their dressage education.



Criteria for Eligibility:

- 1. This ODS Education Scholarship is open to all Oklahoma Dressage Society Members: juniors, adults, or vintage riders, amateurs or professionals, including ODS member volunteers and committee members.
- 2. The candidate must be a current member in good standing of Oklahoma Dressage Society (ODS). In addition, the applicant must have been an ODS member for at least the 2 previous years.
- 3. The candidate must have a background of attending previous ODS dressage educational events. The more ODS event attendance, the stronger the candidate for the ODS scholarship. Attendance at non-ODS dressage educational events will be considered as additional input.
- 4. The candidate must have a background of volunteerism for ODS. This includes volunteering on at least one (1) ODS committee or have accumulated five (5) hours of volunteering at ODS events. The more ODS volunteerism, the stronger the candidate for the ODS scholarship. Volunteerism for non-ODS dressage related events will be considered as additional input.

Criteria for Use:

Scholarships may be used toward the registration/entry fees for the following types of dressage educational events:

- Acceptable activities will include ODS and its affiliated chapters educational events, USDF Region 9 and USDF educational events. Additionally, any educational event or clinic given by a USDF/USEF judge, USDF/USEF technical delegate, USDF Certified Instructor, USDF "L" Program graduate, or USDF Medalist.
- 2. Scholarship candidates must receive ODS Scholarship Committee approval for the use of this scholarship at a specific dressage educational event <u>prior</u> to the event occurring.

The ODS Scholarship Committee will review applications for funds and make recommendations to the Board for their vote. The Governing Board will select members to sit on this committee for a period of one year.

Application Deadline:

The ODS Education Scholarship committee will meet a minimum of two times per year. Each scholarship application must be received by the following schedule:

January 1 – May 15 Scholarship(s) to be awarded by June 15.

Presented at the ODS Summer Meeting.

May 16 - November 15 Scholarship(s) to be awarded by Dec. 15.

Presented at the ODS Annual General Meeting.

Please note: Your application must indicate an educational event that is after the award date.

Volunteer Hours: Volunteer hours counting towards ODS Education Scholarships include:

- Volunteering at ODS, its affiliated chapters and Region 9 sponsored shows, clinics, educational
 events, fundraisers, etc. Volunteer hours must be recorded and itemized on the ODS
 Education Scholarship Application Form. Validation of hours will be confirmed by the ODS
 Volunteer Coordinator from each event.
- 2. Write an article in the ODS newsletter.
- 3. Consideration will also be given for attendance at ODS, its affiliated chapters and Region 9 sponsored activities or functions. (ex: Summer Meeting, AGM or auditing the ODS Educational events).

Scholarship monies will not be awarded until after successful completion of attendance at the

approved dressage educational event with <u>validation of the attendance</u>; and, the <u>submission to ODS</u> of the required post report. An amount of \$200 will be awarded. Scholarship winners must write a post report article about their educational experience for which the scholarship was used and submit it to the ODS Scholarship Committee within 30 days of the event. This report / article will then be published in the newsletter.

The ODS Educational Scholarship is non-transferable and may only be used for the candidate's education. (ex. It may not be used for someone else riding your horse in a clinic.) Scholarships must be used within 1 year of the time it is awarded. No extensions will be granted.

The ODS Educational Scholarship Funds to administer the program should be held in a separate, interest-bearing account or with its own sub-account in ODS general funds. The ODS Educational Scholarship Fund must maintain a balance to fund this venture and a minimum of \$200 must remain in this account at all times. The funds generated by the silent auction at any AGM will be placed in the ODS Education Scholarship fund. Any sponsorship donations to this account will also be welcome.

Additional Information:

Scholarships may be applied for at any time of year by the corresponding deadline.

The ODS Educational Scholarship Committee will meet a minimum of two (2) times per year (June & December) to review all applications received up to that point and make the decisions about its awards. The ODS Educational Scholarship Committee may award zero (0) scholarships, or may award more than two (2) scholarships at each of these meetings as they deem fit. A maximum of four (4) Scholarships may be awarded each year. Not all allotted scholarships must be awarded in a single year. Determination of eligibility is at the sole discretion of the ODS Education Scholarship Committee.

An ODS member may only be awarded a scholarship once per twelve (12) months period. Once awarded a scholarship in a given twelve (12) months, a candidate may not apply again within that same twelve (12) months period. However, priority for subsequent years will be given to eligible candidates who have not received an education scholarship previously.

The ODS Education Scholarship Committee will include at least one (1) current ODS Board Member. The committee must consist of a total of three (3) to five (5) ODS members in good standing. The committee shall not exceed five (5) members.




